## **SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures**

#### 4.1. General First Aid Information

## 4.2. Most Important Symptoms and Effects, Acute and Delayed

Mildly corrosive liquid. May be fatal if swallowed. May cause irritation to all areas of contact. Harmful if inhaled. Inhalation may cause lung and tooth damage. Immediately wash areas of contact with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. If ingested, give large quantity of water. Do not induce vomiting. EYE CONTACT: Eye contact may cause severe eye damage followed by loss of sight. Vapor exposure may cause watering and irritation to eyes. SKIN CONTACT: May cause irritation, redness, and pain.
