## SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures

### 4.1. General First Aid Information

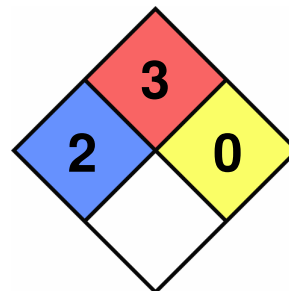
