4.1. General First Aid Information

4.2. Most Important Symptoms and Effects, Acute and Delayed

DANGER! Toxic. Strong Oxidizer. Contact with other material may cause a fire. Causes irritation to areas of contact. Harmful if swallowed or inhaled. May cause allergic reaction. Cancer hazard. Risk of cancer depends on duration and level of exposure.

EYE CONTACT: Eye contact may cause severe eye damage followed by loss of sight. Vapor exposure may cause watering and irritation to eyes. SKIN CONTACT: May produce pain, redness, severe irritation or full thickness burns. May be absorbed through the skin with possible systemic effects.


